

Garry sparks revival chorus

HYDE made one of the comebacks of the season on Saturday, and much of the credit must go to an inspired substitution by Mike McKenzie.

With 60 minutes gone, Brian Ross had given Chorley a two-goal lead, and only the most optimistic fans would have given the Tigers any chance of maintaining their ten-game unbeaten run.

Then, McKenzie threw playmaker Garry Henshaw into the fray and, suddenly, there were chances.

Without the inspirational Lutel James, Hyde struggled to look effective during the first hour. Their attack was stifled from the start and, when the Magpies began to take over in midfield, things looked bleak.

Few could deny Chorley were worth their 21st-minute opener, Ross tapping home a rebound after Martin Jones had brilliantly kept out a Kenny Mayers cracker.

Karl Marginson almost doubled the score with a curling free kick, but Jones plucked it from the top corner.

The Tigers' only real effort in a worrying first half was a Val Owen header, which Simon Marsh scrambled away for a corner.

Five minutes after the break, Chorley scored their second goal when Jones could only push away Mar-

ginson's low shot, and Ross stabbed home.

Seconds later, Ross missed an open goal and, as things went on, that was to prove costly.

McKenzie responded by swapping makeshift striker Jason Donnelly for Henshaw and, suddenly, Hyde were a team again, functioning as a unit.

Within less than two minutes, a defence-splitting ball found Tony Carroll, who raced to the edge of the box before tucking it low past Marsh.

The Tigers began to push and, 13 minutes later, Carroll hit an unstoppable shot a full 25 yards into the bottom corner.

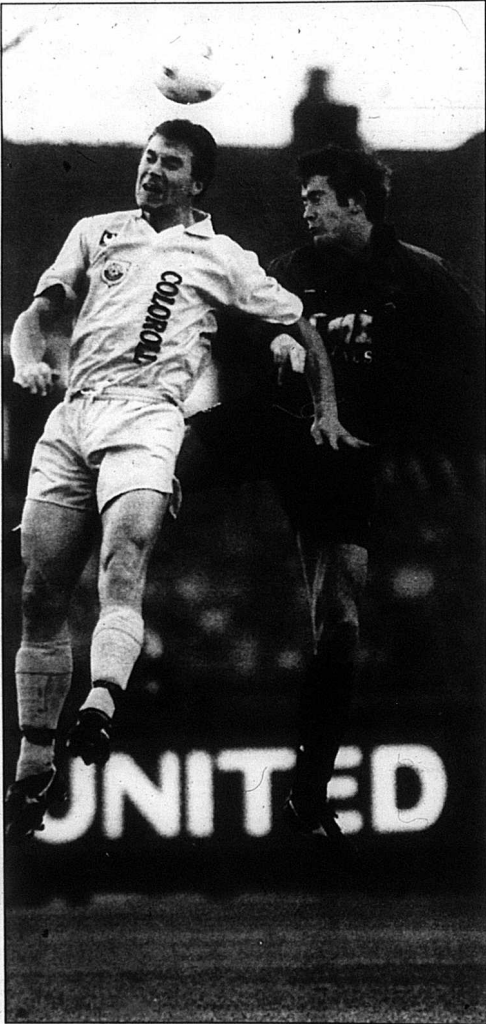
As fans screamed for a winner, Hyde attacked again, and Ged Kimmins crashed a low Carroll cross off the bar with Marsh nowhere.

Seven minutes from time, Hyde netted the winner. Dave Nolan's shot hit the post, and Owen fired home the rebound.
