Hyde celebrated their escape by pouring forward, and took the lead within 60 seconds. Kimmins angled a cross behind the defence; and Carroll, ghosting in, dispatched the most emphatic of headers.

The Tigers proceeded to lay siege to the home goal, and extended their lead on 32 minutes. Esdaille helped on Garry Vaughan's corner and, although his first effort was blocked by Robbie McKie, Val Owen followed up.

The barrage continued in the minutes leading

up to the interval. Carroll crashed a 20-yard volley against an upright, and Iain McClellan headed at Steve Lyons when he ought to have scored.

The second half was scarcely as exciting, although credit to Droylsden for trying to make a game of it. It might have been different had Lyons not saved from Esdaille, or had Dave Nolan hit the target with the goal at his mercy. As Hyde relaxed, the Bloods might easily have
