## Tobin adds vital touch

HYDE pulled off a two-pronged assault on Guiseley, on Saturday. Their win was the first by any side at Nethermoor this season and, temporarily at least, put a dent in the Yorkshire side's title hopes.

The match was decided in the 75th minute, when Tony Carroll broke down the right. He beat England full-back Colin Hogarth before putting the ball into the middle, where Steve Tobin was on hand to send the travelling fans into raptures of delight.

Hyde had, in fact, set off well and caused their hosts plenty of problems by winning a string of corners early on.

However, a side that had kept three successive clean sheets was certainly not going to be breached easily.

Guiseley settled, and started to take control.

The Tigers never stopped playing good football, but there were chances for Mitch Cook and Geoff Horsfield. Hogarth put a free kick just over the top, and Billy Roberts had a shot blocked.

Roberts also put a shot into the side netting before Hyde hit back with a good attempt by Ged Kimmins. Later, Arthur Williams did well to hold a shot from Matt Flanagan.

Right after the goal, Colin Little beat the off-side trap and tore upfield only to be stopped by the impressive home keeper, Steve Dickinson.

With ten minutes to go, Mike McKenzie brought on Dave Esdaille for Carroll, and the Tigers upped a gear, putting their hosts under more pressure.

And it got worse for the Yorkshiremen when central defender Paul Kendall had to leave the field, forcing player-manager Cook to drop back in a bid to stem the tide of Tigers' attacks.

Kimmins flashed a header past the post, as the game finished with highly-rated Guiseley side in complete disarray.
