

Little applies killer punch



STRIKER Colin Little added another two goals to his increasing tally as the Tigers returned to second place in the UniBond League on Saturday.

Mike McKenzie saw his team achieve a second four-goal victory at his former club - sweet revenge for Winsford's 2-1 win earlier in the season.

However, Hyde's victory was not as emphatic as the scoreline would suggest. Winsford had the better of the first half, but they were let down by their finishing, and the Tigers punished them by taking the lead on 16 minutes.

David Nolan's shot appeared to be going wide before a body deflected the ball into the net.

Winsford equalised on the half-hour, when Phil Farrelly's header squirmed under Arthur Williams.

The home team were fancying their chances at half time, but they were soon staring defeat in the face -

and Colin Little was the chief destroyer.

He gave Hyde the lead again on 55 minutes, after George Switzer's 25-yard free kick cannoned off the bar. Little was on hand to convert the rebound.

Ten minutes later, a fine move was ended in style, when Little turned in a superb pinpoint cross from Ged Kimmins.

Three minutes more, and the game was over as a contest when another dangerous Kimmins cross ended up in the net when Tony Carroll just got a toe to the ball as he placed maximum pressure on Mark McCarrick.
